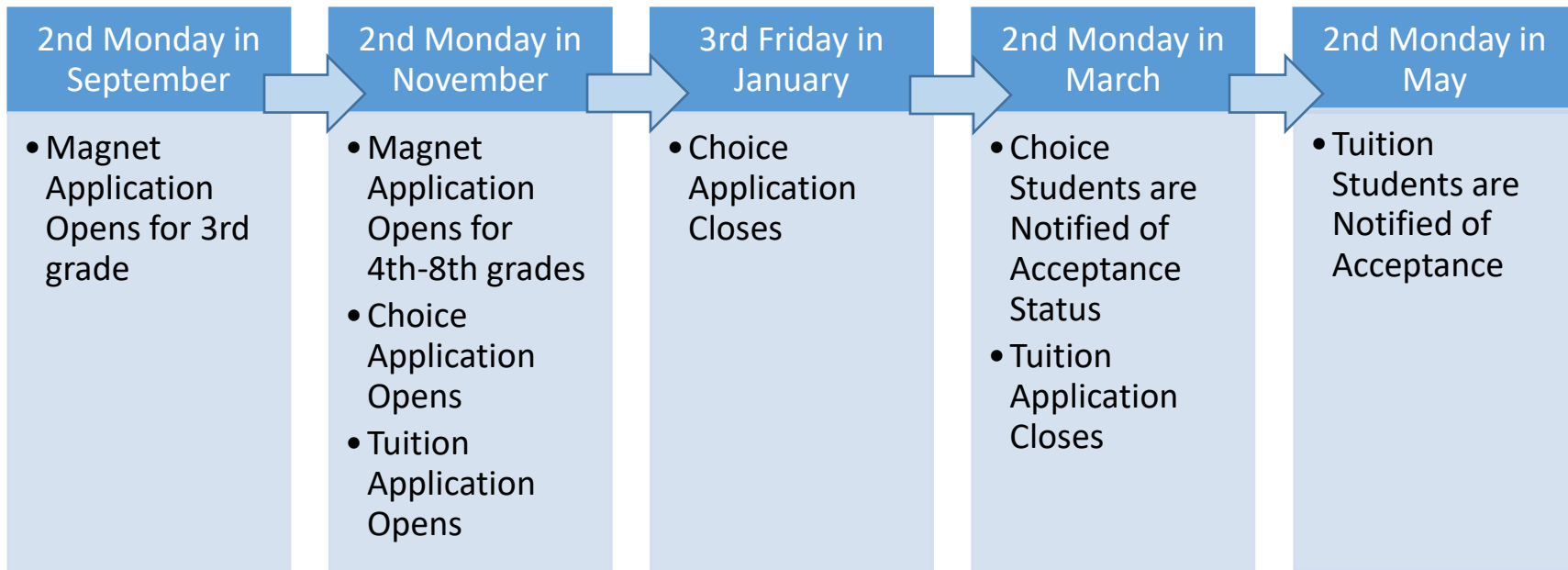




## Timeline of MCS Enrollment Application Programs

\*All dates also apply to MCS Employees participating in the application programs



\***Out of district** Magnet students will not be officially accepted into the Magnet program until their Tuition application has been approved.

\*Hardship Transfers are ongoing throughout the school year. Decisions are made within 30 days of the receipt of the request.

# MCS Enrollment Application Programs

Which situation below applies to your student?

<b>In District:</b> If you live in district, you will be applying for either the <b>Magnet</b> program at MCAA, MSGA, or MMS or the <b>Choice</b> program to select a different elementary school than the one for which you are zoned.	<b>Out of District:</b> If you live out of district, you will be applying for the <b>Non-Resident (Tuition)</b> program at any school and may apply for the <b>Magnet</b> program at MCAA, MSGA, or MMS.	<b>Student of MCS Employee:</b> If you are an MCS employee, you will be applying for either the <b>Magnet</b> program at MCAA, MSGA or MMS, the <b>Choice</b> program, or the <b>Work Site Placement</b> program.
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## Process and Deadlines

**Magnet for 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade:** Students who earn a 75% in either math or reading will receive initial communication, after the fall and winter MAP administration, to participate in the other qualifying factors for acceptance the second week in September. Students with the highest point totals and current MCAA siblings who earn 75/100 points will be notified of acceptance in February. All application paperwork must be returned and formal acceptance must be completed before the MCS February break. In-district students have priority in enrollment over all other student groups. Once capacity is full, an in-district wait list will be created. After that, out-of-district qualifying tuition students will be offered enrollment spots. **Magnet for 4<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> Grades:** Applications for the Magnet program open the 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday in November and close 10 business days after the last day of school. Out of district students will also need to be approved for Tuition (see process below). The application process consists of a Magnet application, Student Registration Form, and Enrollment Agreement. **Choice:** Applications for the Choice program open the 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday in November and close the 3<sup>rd</sup> Friday in January. The Office of Academic Achievement and Programs notifies students of acceptance the 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday in March. The application process consists of a Choice application and an Enrollment Agreement. For more information, please visit <http://www.marietta-city.org/ChoiceAcademies>.

**Non-Resident (Tuition):** Applications for the Tuition program open the 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday in November and close the 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday in March. Due to the need to verify space for acceptance of tuition students, students are not notified of acceptance by the Office of Academic Achievement and Programs until the 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday in May. The application process consists of a Non-Resident Student Enrollment application and Enrollment Agreement. **MCS Employees:** If you are an **in district** employee and wish to have your student attend a school other than the one for which he or she is zoned, please complete the Choice application, including the Employee section, and the MCS Enrollment Agreement. **This also includes in district employees applying for the Work Site Placement program.** If you are an **out of district** employee and wish to have your student attend MCS, you must complete the Non-Resident Student Enrollment application process as described above, including the MCS Enrollment Agreement. **This also includes out of district employees applying for the Work Site Placement program.**

**Hardship Transfers:** Students who need to be placed at a different school due to legal, medical, child care or other issues may apply for a Hardship transfer. Decisions regarding Hardships are made by the Office of Academic Achievement and Programs within 30 days of the receipt of the request.
