- Reading and Math will be taught partially in a whole class setting and partially in a small group setting. Students will begin their Reading and Math lessons as a whole class and then break off into groups of roughly 5-7 students for personalized or individualized instruction from their teacher
- In Kindergarten, 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th grades, your child’s virtual teacher will be the same as their homeroom teacher, however, there will be some support teachers offering additional one-on-one learning and small group instruction
- In 5th grade, your child will have two teachers
 - One teacher for Reading and Social Studies
 - One teacher for Math and Science
 - Your child’s homeroom teacher will also be their writing teacher

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- Attendance will be taken each day for each required section!
- Specific Classroom Schedules with ZOOM links will be given during Sneak-A-Peak and emailed to classes/parents. Access links will also be available on the teacher's Schoology site.
- MILE will be offered to students who have already qualified. The MILE teachers will follow the same expectations for live instruction and small group work sessions as listed above.
- ESOL will be offered to students who have already qualified or who have been recently given the WAP-T assessment. ESOL services will be offered through small group instruction or through one-on-one instruction.
- Special Education services will be offered for students who qualify. Your child's case manager will contact you with more information and details.
