5. Potential Retentions based on 70% core Avgs and MAP Projected Level 1

*Academic progress update: we are maintaining our goal –80% of students maintaining a passing grade in their core classes

*This school year is a baseline

*Milestones are required this year –used for progress and the test has to be given in person, virtual students do not have to take the test, we did apply for a waiver, the test is hold-harmless for promotion/retention

*MAP still will be given; G-MAP will eventually replace Milestones

6. After School Targeted Remediation Update

*This year modified the use of MAP in determining potential Promotion/Retention using the projection data in MAP—Students projected to be at level 1 and students who had a failing average (below 70) in any one of their core content classes. 326 students currently fall into that category. Parents have received letters

*MSGA did not use quarter one grades or attendance for the promotion/retention



- *Summer school recommended for this year to be in person.
- *After school tutoring updates:
 - Fall extended day different from the spring—Budget, days, teachers, and classes offered. All in person. Spring –most students are attending ELA and Math.
 - Most teachers have 5-7 students; every student in Math and Reading Connections received an invitation. No students turned away.
 - Language Acquisition program, in person, participation---working
 - Covid rules, teacher absences, transportation, dismissal during tutoring---not working

- *Communication to all 5th graders through Aspen
- *Schoolology for 5th graders –course –students can communicate with Administration and get 6th grade information
